In order to qualify for Social Security Disability benefits based on a mental disorder, your condition must be diagnosed by a doctor and meet the criteria which any other illness or injury must meet in order to qualify for disability, namely: The mental disorder must prevent you from doing any work which you have done up until now.

What Mental Disorders Qualify for Social Security ...

Social Security's decision-makers use the Blue Book to make decisions on Disability claims. "Mental Disorders" is a category in the Blue Book where a list of mental impairments can be found. Some mental health conditions that may qualify for Disability benefits include: Anxiety; Bipolar Disorder; Depression; Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder; Schizophrenia

Although mental health and substance use disorders is within the top-five causes of disease burden globally (as measured by Disability-Adjusted Life Years; DALYs), accounting for approximately 7 percent of the burden, several authors have highlighted that such figures — since they do not include suicide DALYs — underestimate the true cost of mental health disorders. 14
